Manuscript preparation guidelines for authors

I. The manuscript should generally not exceed 3000 words and 30 references for an original article. Review article should have 4000-5000 words and at least 40 references. Word count for a case report should not exceed 1000 and references should not be more than 5. In case of a brief communication word count should be limited to 1000 and references limited to 10. It may contain one table and one figure. Letter to the editor is limited to 500 words and 5 references.

II. An abstract not exceeding 250 words for original and review articles and 50 words for case reports. The abstract must be structured (background, methods, results, and conclusion) in case of original research paper.

III. Keywords: A list of 3 to 10 key words of Medical Subjects Headings (MeSH) from Index Medicus should be added to bottom of the abstract page.

IV. References must be in Vancouver style and serial number of each reference in the text must be given as superscript.

V. Number of tables should be limited and the content of the table should not be repeated in the text.

VI. Research paper should explain well how the research was conducted, what methods were used, and what statistical tools were used in data analysis.

VII. Manuscript must be written in good English.
